Transdisciplinary Theme: Where we are in place and time.

Lines of Inquiry:

- Traditional costumes and uniforms.

Discussion on Activity:

- Students were asked the following questions?

 2. Do you wear the same clothes if you have to go to a relative's house or in the case of a festival?
 3. What are your favorite clothes in both cases?
- **Activity** –Reflection on the statements using different coloured markers in the chart to indicate whether he/she agrees, disagrees, or is not sure. (Clothes for various seasons)
- Explored the word ‘Blanket’ in their native language and shared it in the class.
- **Video:** ‘Peacocks and Pakodas’
- **Illustration:** Sequencing the story ‘Peacocks and Pakodas’.
